## What is Payroll Giving?

Payroll Giving is one of the easiest and most flexible methods of giving a regular donation to Jewish Care.

It's simple and effective and doesn't require you to do anything more than inform your payroll department.

Each month your donation is taken out of your salary BEFORE you pay any tax (that's your GROSS PAY) which means that any money meant for tax will now go directly to Jewish Care. This method of giving costs you less to give more.

## Why choose Payroll Giving?

Jewish Care provides many opportunities for people to support us. Attending one of our fundraising events, advertisements in our souvenir brochures or simply responding to one of our direct appeals has been a traditional way of donating money. Payroll Giving enables potential donors to support Jewish Care as a regular, tax efficient way of giving money.



## How much can I give?

It's entirely up to you. You can give as much or as little as you like, for as long as you like! Remember that the income tax you would have paid is now topping up your donation directly to Jewish Care! Some examples are given below:
